
Proposal for Local Lettings Initiative for 2 bed properties 2021 – tenant consultation

We sent the tenant consultation by email to those on our Register of Interested Tenants. We sent 196 emails using the Survey Monkey platform and received 33 responses in total.

The response rate for the survey is 16.84% of those invited to take part.

The consultation consisted of five questions, the results have been summarised below.


Q1 Do you feel that a Local Lettings Initiative is the right action Langstane should take to increase interest in two bedroom properties?


Q2 We are considering the lettings initiative to avoid lost income for properties lying empty longer than they need to. Do you feel this is important and should be a priority for the Association?



Summary

Overall the responses highlight a positive outlook towards using a lettings initiative with almost 80% of respondents in favour of the proposal.

When asked about using the initiative to avoid income loss 81% of respondents were happy with this, however almost 16% were not. For question three 79% were in favour of the proposed application criteria to be used and for question four, 91% said they thought it was reasonable for the initiative to be extended into rural areas.

Various comments and suggestions were left throughout the survey with some suggestions on other options for using void properties i.e., for single people, students and those with disabilities or with carers.

Outcome of consultation

Feedback from consultation will be considered when deciding on how to deal with hard to let properties.
